<p>Federal Technical Assistance Update : Ann reported out on Federal Technical Assistance:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Karen Heying -Zero- Three has staff that can Build On One Step at a Time • Ann reported that Zero-Three has a new curriculum which could possibly be used as an enhancement to One Step at a Time (strong emphasis on social/emotional)- Curriculum scheduled to be field tested with community colleges. The training guide is currently at the printers • Karen Heying can set up conference call between committee and Kansas/Iowa • Child Care Bureau extended grant to September 2004 with possible additional resources • Douglas Klayman to obtain Models of Evaluation for possible use in WV (Model In house). He will get in the next month/two • Zero-Three has resources to assist with 2 Day Retreat 	<p>Ann will speak further with Karen about obtaining Zero-Three consultant and building on One Step at a Time and request copies of their curriculum when available for committee to look at.</p> <p>Committee members said that they are interested in being present at the conference but did not suggest dates. Requested that date be scheduled and if available will attend</p> <p>Ann states she will follow up with Douglas on Models of Evaluation</p> <p>Ann states she will place Karen Heying on her calendar for regular telephone conferences (Bi-Weekly) .</p>

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<p>Report Out/Researching Effective Practices(Goal #1): Judy discussed article on Issues and Recommendations in the Training of Infant and Toddler Caregivers (ZERO-Three)- article discussed in service training model, issues in training caregivers and recommendations in providing training. Judy also gave handouts on State Developments in Infant and Toddler Care 2001 and what other states are doing with I&T earmark dollars.</p> <p>Beth provided handouts on NACCRRRA(EXECUTIVE Summary) and the National Center for Children in Poverty research. Beth gave overview of research (see handouts) on training .</p> <p>Ann reported out on Zero- Three Trainer Model: Their model trains caregivers to care for children. Ann also stated: Nancy Cheshire found out that Government sponsored CC does not have a system for I&T care. Nancy also found out that Department of Defense uses modules by "Teaching Strategies". Nancy is waiting for more information to arrive and will report out when information is obtained. Helen Post Brown is still researching Corporate Models and will report out when information is obtained.</p> <p>Margie Hale reported out on the Abecedarian Study(hand out) which used a highly individualized curriculum based on Child's need and provided handouts on number of minority Infant and Toddlers living in WV and also discussed a study titled " The NICHD Study of Early Child Care and Youth Development", which is a longitudinal study that looks at the correlation between child care experiences and child developmental outcomes. The researchers are in Phase III of the study. Margie also reported out on Caring for Infants and Toddlers: Analysis and Recommendations. County Centers use Creative Curriculum - Staff obtain training from Teaching Strategies in DC. Staff are called Curriculum specialist and coach and offer TA to centers. Also receive training from West Ed, ITERS-R. • Bill will find out and report out on what the other Early Head Start grantees are using.

FACTS DATA Collection:

- Collects Number of caregivers and educational backgrounds
- Does not collect how many in ACDS
- Does collect if Family Child Care provider has received Infant and Toddler Training
- Does not collect how many providers in a center/facility that have completed One Step at a Time Training
 - or total still working or other training
- Does track Director if entered as contact person
- Does collect number of Infant and toddler in each county who receive subsidized care (poverty)
- Does track how many centers are licensed to provide Infant and Toddler Care
- Does collect waiting list Information for Infant and toddlers
- Does collect licensed capacity but not specifically infant and toddler for centers but does for family CC
- Does track years of experience of provider
- Does track provider education
- Does track provider race, gender, date of birth
- Does not track trainers and where located
- Does track whether NAEYC approved
- Does not track turnover rate
- Does track race/ethnicity of subsidized infant and toddlers
- Does track subsidized infant and toddler with special needs
- Does track location of providers
- Does track compliance with regulations
- Does not track training R&R offers; however has the potential Training connections tracks number of sessions being offered ... training connections tracks who is being trained if on career pathway
- FACTS has potential to collect continuing education record of trainer
- Other Issues; who is responsible to enter to make sure current and reliable?
- May be based in future

Goal # 1 Decisions Cont.

Trainers:

- Cross Trainer System with Quality safeguards/accountability
- Ongoing Meeting of/with Trainers with State Oversight (i.e.: Training Connections Model- One oversight entity
- I&T sub group to make recommendation on such things as job description and collaboration
- I&T Committee will write training policy that outlines minimal standards and procedures (i.e. Class size, location, frequency etc.)
- I&T Committee recommend to PIECES how to systematize I&T training

I&T Resources:

- Materials
- Stipends

Recommendations:

- Judy will research what other states are doing with center implementation plans (i.e.; upon completion of training submit plan about how center will implement training and what resources they need to implement)
- Judy will find out if Center gets \$400.00 stipend if they do not accept subsidy (private pay only)
- DHHR Early Care and Education staff review Judy's research on subsidy and bring recommendations to I&T committee
- Vote on recommendations/options at Feb., 04 meeting

Subsidy Option(4):

1. Give majority to center/rest to caregiver
2. Center reimbursed flat rate per participant caregiver with portion going to provider
3. Whole stipend to Center
4. Reimburse center minimum wage for one participant per year –small stipend to provider

Goal # 2: Develop a quality improvement system to ensure accountability and continued program improvement for Infant and Toddler caregiver training systems
