SPA 693 – Pediatric Neurobiological Disorders in Children: Evaluation and Management of Communication Disorders in Schools

SPA 693, a **three (3)** semester hour graduate level course, delineates the features of the communication abilities of children with neurological disorders, and provides appropriate screening and assessment tools to differentiate the communication disorders of the children. DVD video clips of case studies will be used to illustrate differences in the communication skills among children with pediatric neurological disorders, including epilepsy, Tourette's Disorder, Autism Spectrum Disorder, Asperger's Disorder, ADD/ADHD, cerebral palsy and others.

Course Delivery: This course includes online readings and activities, a course discussion board and four online real time early evening lectures (Wimba Live Classroom). To participate in the course, the student must have an Internet Service Provider, preferably cable or high-speed access. A modem may be used.

Course enrollment is limited. Tuition Waivers are available. Course may be used for professional development hours or to maintain ASHA Certification and WV Licensure.
